The successful candidate will solicit gifts, provide stewardship, produce development proposals and work with the DAR's alumni association to engage alumni and friends.

Regional and national travel is dependent upon the donor portfolio and can range from 25 to 40% of an Associate Director or Director of Development's time. Evening and weekend work is required.
